



Tips for applying:

- This is a competitive internship (337 applicants in 2020), so put your best effort into what will be the companies' first look at the work you can do and how well you communicate.
- Develop a strong resume and cover letter that showcases your strengths, experiences and educational interests.
- Just because you don't have the experience does not mean you would not be a good fit for the role. These are learning and working internships. Apply and speak to your interests and strengths.
- Update your profile on [LinkedIn](#) and start using the platform. You will find that many of our companies are very active on LinkedIn and following them is a great idea.
- Our portfolio companies are looking for mission driven people; speak to the mission as much as you can. Consider the future of the climate tech industry and how you want to contribute your strengths to that industry.
- Since there is a limit to how many cover letters you can submit with your application, this might be more challenging. You can create one or two individualized cover letters.
- If you are going for one letter for all roles, speak to your interest in working in a startup focused on climate change solutions in a way that speaks to each company, while speaking to all.
